Amelia soon took flight lessons in California and quickly became a skilled pilot. In 1920, Amelia bought her first plane naming it "The Canary." After just two years of flying planes, she was already


attempting to break records. Amelia broke the woman's altitude record

of 14,000 feet, became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean, broke speed records, and was the first woman to fly solo coast to coast. Amelia Earhart was also involved with many activities outside of flying airplanes. She published her own book, was the aviation editor of Cosmopolitan Magazine, and

served as vice-president of public relations for an airline company.



In 1935, Amelia began planning a flight around the entire world. She set out on this trip on June 1, 1937, with the world watching with excitement. After flying over 22,000 miles and with only 7,000 miles left, Amelia Earhart disappeared over the Pacific Ocean. Nobody knows what happened to Amelia Earhart. Although

she was never found, Amelia was declared legally dead in 1939. Amelia Earhart and her accomplishments are an inspiration to many today.
