
Who Created the Department of the Navy?

John Adams was the second President of the United States and one of the country's founding fathers. John Adams was born in Massachusetts in 1735. His father was a farmer and a Puritan. John Adams was the eldest of three sons and an excellent student. He was accepted into Harvard University, at the age of 16, where he studied law and earned his master's degree. After Harvard, Adams began practicing law. One of his most important cases was defending the British soldiers on trial for killing five colonists in what

Abigail Smith, his third cousin. They had six children, including John Quincy Adams, who later in life was elected the sixth President of the United States.


In 1771, Adams was elected to the Massachusetts House

of Representatives, and in 1774 to the First Continental Congress. He was an important voice in the Continental Congress and a strong supporter of independence from England. John Adams was asked to help write the Declaration of Independence but declined because he thought Thomas Jefferson should write it. Adams served on over 90 committees for the new government of the colonies fighting for Independence from England. Adams was one of



the diplomats sent to England to negotiate the Treaty of Paris, which ended the Revolutionary War.

After the United States gained its independence, John Adams served as George Washington's Vice President for two terms. He went on to win election as the second President of the United States. As president, he created the Department of the Navy and worked to build up the national defenses. In his bid for a second term, Adams was defeated by Thomas Jefferson, the third President of the United States.



After his loss to Jefferson, John Adams moved to Quincy with his wife, Abigail Adams. In time, he became good friends with Thomas Jefferson. Adams and Jefferson began to write to each other often and remained friends until their deaths. John Adams died on July 4, 1826, on the same day as Thomas Jefferson.


