Harriet Tubman was a spy and guide for the Union.

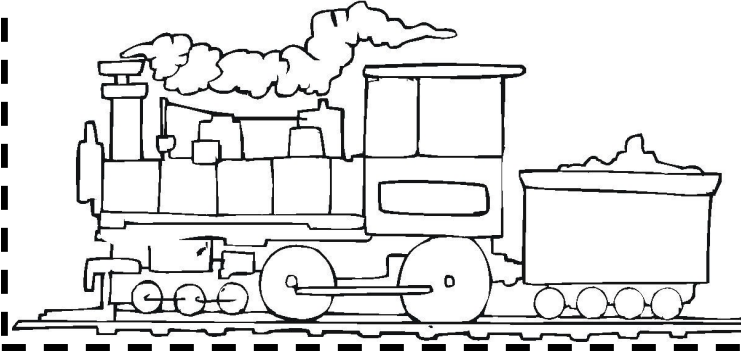
