Who made the famous ride from Boston to Concord to warn the colonists that the British were coming?

Paul Revere was born in Boston. His father was a goldsmith, and Paul followed the same profession.

He won fame for his etchings on printing plates. His most famous etching was a depiction of the Boston Massacre in 1770.

Paul Revere was also one of the patriots who dressed as Indians during the Boston Tea Party. With the beginning of the struggle of the American Revolution, he carried messages for the revolutionaries in the area. Revere and two other men made the famous ride from Boston to Concord at midnight to signal the arrival of British troops.

He also printed money for the Congress of Massachusetts and designed the First United Colonies official seal, as well as the official seal that Massachusetts still uses today.

When the War for Independence came to an end, he continued working as a silversmith.
