



Olympic flag with five rings was designed by Pierre de Coubertin in August 1912.

The Olympic Winter Games is a major international sporting event held once every four years, for sports practiced on snow and ice.

The symbol of the Olympic games is five interlocking rings with three rings on the top and two on the bottom.

The rings represent the five inhabited continents of the world: Africa, America, Asia, Australia and Europe. The interlaced Olympic rings stand for unity among the five continents.

The colors are blue, black, red, yellow and green. At least one of the five colors among the rings is present on the flag of each of the participating countries.
